Chairs report:

Sue asked group to vote in Jane Lucas as Full Secretary as Bridget had agreed to retire as Minutes Secretary as she only stepped in to help me out at the very beginning. Vote was unanimous.

Sue praised the group on how everyone was working so well together as a team and the group has such an amalgam of different skills.

Sue asked the group if they would support Matt Bushell's idea of an Arboretum in The Gullacombe Valley. The group all agreed enthusiastically in principle as long as the funding did not have to come from the group. The group agreed that 106 money should be used for it. In the evening Matt asked David to agenda this item on The Amenities Group. Sue H asked if she could attend one of their meetings and David agreed. Will locke offered us an oak tree which the group agreed to put in Central Park. **Action : Will Locke**

Sue reported on the state of all areas .. Pannier Market Beds and three circular beds at the end of North St completed. Schools now have their goods from the anonymous business sponsorship money ie £52 compost for Cof E School and £5.20 worth of compost plus the rest in plants from the Plant Stall for The Community School. Joanne has since collected all of the plants. We are yet to donate a few runner bean plants. We are still to plant all the beds in East St and the town. The grasses still need to go around the path in the Burial Ground leading up to the tree. We still have to plant the four planters there too. We need some more plants in Lorry Wash, New Rd, Church Walk, Squires Court, Livarot and Community Woodland Gateway Pathway and Library Gardens. Central Park : Fence still to be painted with Homebase Paint and still to plant entrance beds to CP. Climbers still to be done up the painted fence. The tyres are completed.

Sue H gave the **Treasurer's report** as The Nat West have removed Ruth but not yet agreed to Mary. Report is attached. Sue also ran through all the sponsors to date and thanked them for their generosity

Matt suggested we might ask for compensation from Nat West Action: Sue H to complete

Councillor Grants

Discussion ensued about grants. Sue Explained that she had asked Matt, David and Paul for £1080 specialised tulips, hyacinths & hellebores. Decision yet to be announced.

Plant Sale

The group thanked Debbie and her family for another fantastic result, raising £200.30 pence and in fact in essence more, as we gave the school at least £50 worth of plants from the stalls too. We discussed the next plant sale on 27th May . Sue H said Lynne Miller Christian Aid, is going to bring lots of plants to the stall and various members offered to help Anne on the day. We may do two tables depending on the weather and Sue H to ring Mel the Market Manager just before the day.

Plan between now and Judging Day

Group talked about planting at The Medical centre area and in their three planters – a suggestion of NHS logo was made. <u>Action:</u> Kirstie to design and plant !

Wood Chips donation from the Honey farm: All agreed to be put on beds after final planting.

Schools: they are to submit a portfolio of their gardens and works for judging day

Group agreed much work to be done before judging in terms of planting, weeding and laying wood chips. Work groups to be organised throughout June.

Beds in Town: need, work taking out old stuff & lifting daffodil bulbs if good for storage. **Action: Mervyn** to drop off compost for filling & replanting

Sue gave the news that Henry from the Wombles would like to take responsibility for the little bed next to The Skate Park to put in succulents and cacti .. we just need to weed and prepare it for him.

Julie raised the question as to whether we could repair the Central Park Welome sign **Action: Sue H to take photos and talk to Mens Shed**
